As discussed, here are the key details relating to the URLs provided by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] provided both the eSafety Commissioner and the Australian Federal Police with a list of 43 URLs and 29 domains blocked by the company on the grounds that they provided access to the Christchurch attack video.

The eSafety Commissioner has assessed the 43 URLs to determine whether material is still available at those locations.

We have discovered that

- 12 continue to provide full access to the complete attack video
- 13 continue to provide full access to the manifesto ('The Great Replacement')
- 6 provide links to either the video or manifesto on other websites
- 6 provide access to discussions of the attacks but do not provide either the actual media or links to media, and
- 6 links are no longer available.

The Classification Board as you know has classified both the full attack video and the manifesto as Refused Classification as items advocating the doing of a terrorist act via s 9A of the *Classification (Publications, Films and Computer Games) Act 1995*. If the ISP's unblock then we expect that our new power would be triggered to issue notices to the below domain hosts who are serving the video, as discussed.

We do not anticipate these domain hosts are likely to be compliant.
