Hi Richard

I understand that at least one ISP has been in touch with you directly re the words they plan to use.

The other suggestions from ISPs are the minor amendments indicated below.

So I think you have given us something usable in the interim period many thanks for your help with this!

- Like other Australian Internet Service Providers, we blocked access to some overseas-based websites on the basis they contained footage of the Christchurch shooting and the manifesto of the alleged perpetrator.
- The full video of the Al Noor Mosque attack and the manifesto have been classified by the Australian Classification Board as Refused Classification, which means that the eSafety Commissioner could issue a takedown notice for removal if either were hosted in Australia.
- Since the attacks, we have been closely engaged with relevant federal agencies regarding these blocks.
- At this time, federal agencies have advised us that ~~consider~~ there has been insufficient removal of the offending material across these sites to warrant a change in our approach to blocking.
