I wanted to confirm that [REDACTED]

All requests sent in [REDACTED] and recorded in our Transparency Report, which we share publicly every six months. Whilst you are already familiar with the reporting process, please find enclosed a set of materials which set out how to report content for ease of reference.

To ensure that requests relating to Abhorrent Violent Material (“AVM”) are reviewed as quickly as possible, please mark all requests pursuant to the Law as “AVM” in the subject matter heading when sending requests [REDACTED]. I think you had said that you would be finalizing a specific form for these notifications? If you can please let us know if this has been finalized so that we can brief our teams to lookout for them, that would be much appreciated.

Keeping people safe on Facebook is a priority and we wish to continue working with you on important issues pertaining to safety and content. To this end, we welcome further engagement with you and your office on the implementation of the AVM law, including the nature of material which your office views as AVM, and on the reporting of content which may not clearly constitute AVM.
