General Capabilities

Critical and Creative Thinking

This resource provides students with opportunities to pose questions; identify and clarify information and ideas; and to organise and process information. In addition, students can explore situations, assess options, seek solutions and put their ideas into action.

Ethical Understanding

This resource provides students with opportunities to consider the importance of applying reasoning in decision-making and actions. In addition, students can examine values accepted and enacted within various communities and consider rights and responsibilities when interacting face-to-face, or through social media.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Capability

This resource provides students with opportunities to learn to use ICT effectively and appropriately at school and in their lives beyond school. In addition, students can examine how to limit the risks to themselves and others in a digital environment.

Personal and Social Capability

This resource provides students with opportunities to identify appropriate emotional responses and behaviour, as well as to recognise their strengths and weaknesses. In addition, students can discuss the importance of self-discipline, to analyse the factors that influence their ability to self-regulate and to apply strategies to monitor their own behaviour.

Social Awareness and Social Management

The activities in this study guide require students to better understand relationships by identifying the differences between positive and negative relationships, and ways of managing these. In addition, students can identify causes and effects of conflicts and discuss different strategies to diffuse or resolve conflict situations.
