My concern is with encrypted content.

Specifically if I have material that is confidential, trade secret, and or personal that I have encrypted.

If I encrypt this material and use an online backup service - eg OneDrive, Google drive, AWS, Backblaze:
Will the industry codes dissuade the service providers from hosting the material?

Given the Australian governments repeated extensions and intrusions into previously setup systems - eg myHealthRecord, MyGovId -

Why would we not expect the government to push online service providers to reject hosting any material they can't scan? or even terminate people's account?

How will the eSafety Commissioner guarantee and assume liability for breaches of confidence caused by them imposing scanning requirements on online services?

What mechanisms will exist to allow appeal against false positives? Google are famously hard to contact regarding account issues.

I do not accept the assurance from eSafety "It does not require encryption to be weakened or subverted."

The government has repeatedly reneged on similar promises - eg myHealthRecord opt out available - why should we believe you now?
