

# Power up your protection online

A Virtual Classroom webinar for Year 3 and 4 students



## Teacher notes

These notes support eSafety's Virtual Classroom webinar, '**Be an eSafe kid: Power up your protection online**'. The webinar is designed to help students in Year 3 and 4 learn how to protect themselves online with practical tools, such as creating strong passphrases and managing privacy settings. Through a scenario, they'll explore how to spot the warning signs and trust their body clues when interacting with others online.

### About the webinar

As part of an integrated online safety program, this webinar can be used to check knowledge and support conversations with students and their families. It aligns with the Australian Curriculum in the key learning areas of Digital Technologies, Health and Physical Education, Humanities and Social Sciences and English.

### Preparing for the webinar

If you would like students to answer the questions on the student worksheet, you can print copies or organise access to an editable PDF on a device.

### Joining the webinar

Join the webinar through the link sent in your registration email. Please log on at least 10 minutes before the session. You will be asked how many students will be attending in your learning space. It is preferable for each learning space to have its own registration.

The webinar will run for approximately 45 minutes.

### Students can participate by:

- listening to the presenter
- recording answers to the questions on the worksheet (optional)
- responding to the teacher-facilitated discussions (use the webinar chat box to record and share the students' answers)
- taking their worksheets home and sharing their learning with their parents and carers.
