Students will discover how to protect themselves online with practical tools such as managing strong passphrases, privacy settings and personal information. Through scenarios, they'll explore how to investigate the warning signs and trust their body clues when experiencing a hacked account and interacting with others online. Empower your students with the knowledge and confidence they need to stay safe online.

As part of an integrated online safety program, this webinar can be used to check knowledge and support conversations with students and their families. It aligns with the Australian Curriculum in the key learning areas of Digital Technologies, Health and Physical Education, Humanities and Social Sciences and English.

Joining the webinar

Join the webinar through the link sent in your registration email. Please log on at least 10 minutes before the session. You will be asked how many students will be attending in your learning space. It is preferable for each learning space to have its own registration.

The webinar will run for approximately 45 minutes.

- responding to the teacher-facilitated discussions (use the webinar chat box to record and share the students' answers)
- taking their worksheets home and sharing their learning with their parents and carers.
