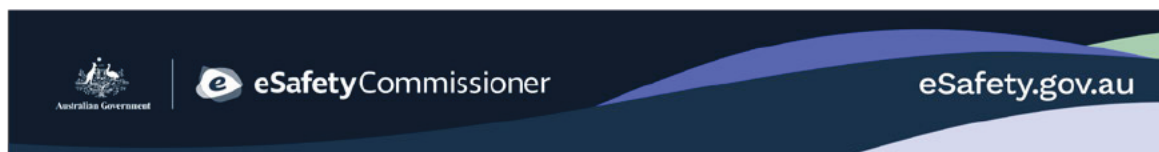

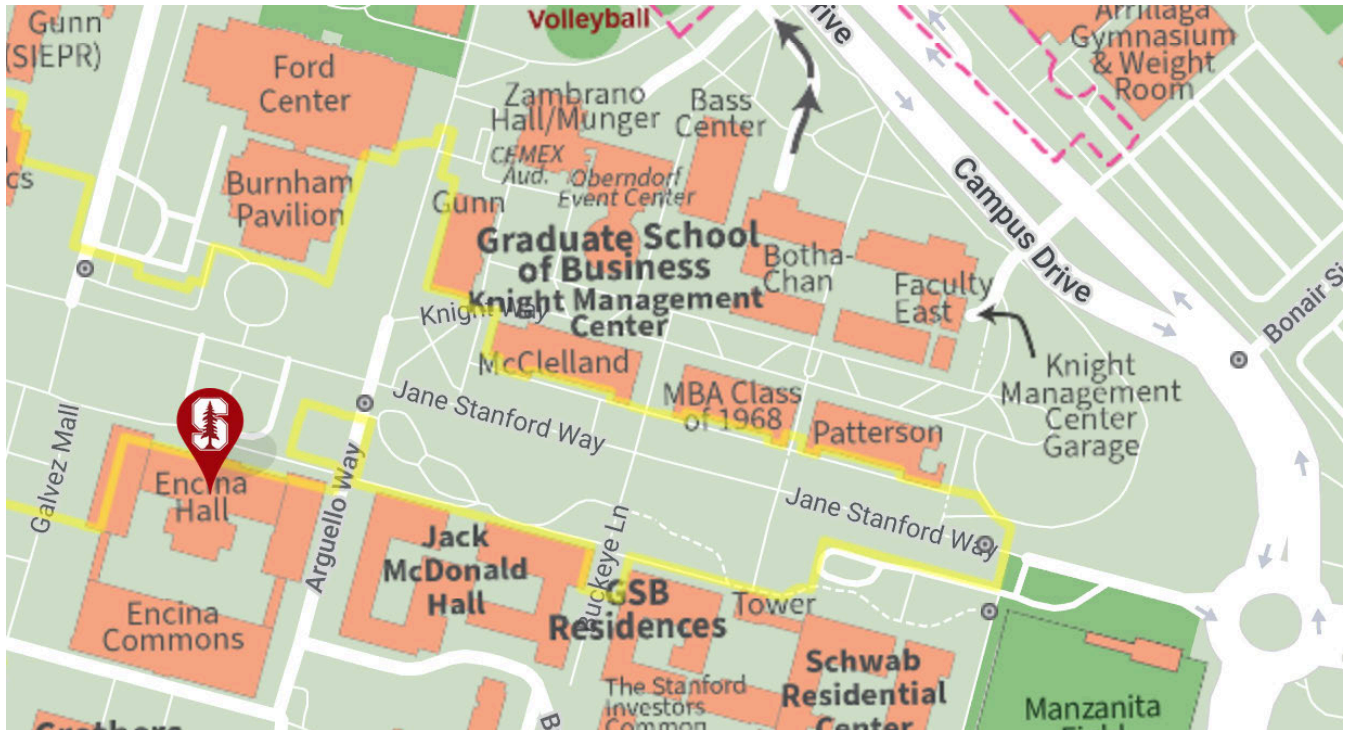

Exercise vigilance and follow all official directives after recent threats and associated lockdowns at university campuses. Multiple universities, including [Alabama State University](#) (Alabama state), [Virginia State University](#) (Virginia state) and [Southern University and A&M College](#) (Louisiana state), reportedly received terrorism threats on 11 September. The threats come amid heightened security concerns after political commentator Charlie Kirk was shot at a university [campus](#) in Utah state (*see related alert*). Such threats must not be underestimated and should be taken seriously until proven otherwise.

ADVICE

- Expect heightened security in the event of an active shooter or other threat in your vicinity. Follow all official directives – including shelter-in-place, lockdown or evacuation orders – by law enforcement and university authorities.

- Avoid the vicinity of the affected campuses until security operations conclude. If you are already nearby, minimise movement until the situation stabilises.
- If planning to travel to an affected area, ensure routes are clear prior to setting out.
- Exercise vigilance and report any suspicious behaviour to the authorities.
- Monitor our US alerts for updates.

MORE DETAIL

Impact

At least six colleges reportedly locked down their campuses and suspended operations after receiving threats on 11 September. Additional threats were reported at [Clark Atlanta University](#) (Georgia state), [Hampton University](#) (Virginia) and [University of Central Florida](#) (Florida state). Most of the universities are Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

During August, reports of active shooters that are later deemed false occurred at [Iowa State University](#) (Iowa state), [Kansas State University](#) (Kansas state), the [University of Arkansas](#) (Arkansas state), the [University of Colorado Boulder](#) (Colorado state) and the [University of New Hampshire](#) (New Hampshire state). Additional hoax calls have been reported at the [University of Tennessee at Chattanooga](#) (Tennessee state), the [University of South Carolina](#) (South Carolina state), [Northern Arizona University](#) (Arizona state) and [Villanova University](#) (Pennsylvania state).

Law enforcement officials responded to all threats swiftly. The affected campuses were put into a lockdown, or a shelter-in-place order was issued, as the police investigated the incidents. No injuries were reported. The intent behind the hoax calls made to these universities still being investigated.

Outlook

Further threats are likely **in the coming hours**. Hoax threats and active shooter calls may persist **in the coming days** as students return to universities ahead of the start of the academic year. Institutions may increase security protocols across campuses to dissuade potential perpetrators.
